Pat Kelly


Pat Kelly grew up in Durham, CA where he began his baseball career at the age of 11 playing in the Durham Little League and continued playing Pony League, Colt League and American Legion. Pat was a 4-sport letterman at Durham High School, played 2 years of football and baseball at Butte Jr. College and 2 years of baseball at Sacramento State College. • After moving to the Sacramento area, Pat played in the Mexican-American League, Night League, and eight years for the Sacramento Smokeys. He began playing in the Sacramento MSBL in 1993 with the A's, and is still playing with the same team twenty years later, at the age of 61. He won the 1994 State Cup with the Sacramento Majic and has played in 15 World Series tournaments in Arizona. He has been on 5 World Series Championship teams; 2 with the Majic and 3 with the Tribe. • Pat coached baseball at El Camino High School for 30 years. He had the privilege of coaching one of the top baseball players coming out of El Camino, Derrek Lee. Pat is currently co-coaching the A's with Joe Soto longtime friend, Sac State Alum and fellow Hall of Famer.



Nelson Randolph

After graduating from Luther Burbank High School, Nelson attended Sacramento City College, playing baseball under Head Coach Jerry Weinstein, who he credits for much of his success as a player and a coach. • After playing at SCC, Nelson played semi-pro ball with the Davis Red Sox and was scouted by the Pittsburg Pirates organization. Though a devastating injury prevented him from achieving his dream of playing professional baseball, Nelson never lost his love and passion for the game and has played in the Davis/Woodland Roy Hobbs league, NABA and MSBL for over 25 years. During this time, Nelson has won 7 championship rings in both Arizona and Florida. In 1998, he represented California in the Nike World Games, leading his team to win the Gold medal with a batting average above .600. Though he has enjoyed many successes playing the game, his great passion is for passing along his vast knowledge of baseball to players of the next generation. • Nelson has been coaching for over 30 years at all age levels. Most recently, he has enjoyed leading a successful program at Capital Christian High School. Capital's record when he started in 2003 was well below .500. Since then, he has led the team to two league championships and

represented the GEL in three consecutive CIF championship games, winning in 2009. He is a back to back coach of the year recipient, and awarded this honor three times in all. As a Division 5 school, CCHS was ranked #13 in the area two consecutive years and #2 in the State of California for Division 4 at the end of the 2008 season. • Nelson has also been the President and Manager of the Sacramento Heat Baseball Club for 9 years, coaching almost 100 players, many of whom are currently playing college baseball from Division 1 and below. In addition, Nelson is the Head Coach of Impact Baseball International, an international baseball organization providing clinics for player development in Honduras, Guatemala, Dominican Republic and Panama. • Though Nelson is highly respected as a passionate coach, mentor and friend, his whole philosophy on coaching can be summed up in the phrase he coined many years ago, "PERFECT Practice Makes Perfect."
